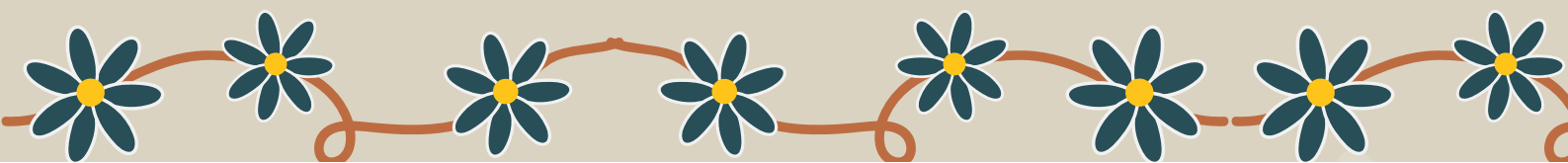


15 things to do with the kids in South Jersey during Spring Break.
