NORTHWEST SPOKANE (INDIAN TRAIL):


Known for its scenic views and suburban atmosphere. It's a residential area with a mix of housing types.



ABOUT THE SCHOOLS IN SPOKANE WA



SPOKANE PUBLIC SCHOOLS (SPS)/DISCTRICT #81:

Is the largest school district in the region, serving a significant portion of the city. It encompasses a variety of elementary, middle, and high schools, offering diverse educational programs.

CENTRAL VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT (CVSD):

Located in the Spokane Valley area, Central Valley School District is one of the larger districts in the region. It serves a mix of suburban and rural communities.

MEAD SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Situated to the north of Spokane, Mead School District serves communities like Mead and Colbert. It is known for its commitment to providing a high-quality education.

WEST VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT (WVSD):

Serves neighborhoods in the West Spokane area, including West Valley and parts of the West Plains. It provides a range of educational programs.

EAST VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT (EVSD):

CLIMATE IN SPOKANE WA

SPOKANE, WASHINGTON, EXPERIENCES A FOUR-SEASON CLIMATE WITH DISTINCT VARIATIONS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. HERE'S AN OVERVIEW OF THE CLIMATE IN SPOKANE:

SUMMER (JUNE TO AUGUST):

- Summers are warm and dry.
- Average high temperatures range from the mid-70s to the mid-80s Fahrenheit (24-30°C).
- July tends to be the warmest month.

FALL (SEPTEMBER TO NOVEMBER):

- Fall brings cooler temperatures and changing foliage.
- Average highs range from the mid-60s to the mid-40s Fahrenheit (18-7°C).
- September is generally milder, while November can bring colder temperatures.

WINTER (DECEMBER TO FEBRUARY):

- Winters are cold with occasional snowfall.
- Average highs range from the mid-30s to the mid-20s
 Fahrenheit (2-(-4)°C).
- December and January are the coldest months, with nighttime temperatures often dropping below freezing.

SPRING (MARCH TO MAY):

- Spring sees a gradual warming and the blossoming of trees and flowers.
- Average highs range from the mid-40s to the mid-60s Fahrenheit (7-18°C).
- May tends to be the wettest month.
