WHAT TO DO/KNOW AHEAD OF TIME?

RESIDING ON/OFF POST

1. On Post

- **a.** Once you are given an official PCS order to Fort Cavazos, you can apply to be on the waitlist.
- **b.** *You will not be activated until the active duty member signs out of the current duty station.

2. Off Post

a. Here is a list of local cities that are popular locations to live in: Belton, Copperas Cove, Harker Heights, Killen, Nolanville, Temple

MEDICAL RECORDS

1. Gather all medical and dental records from current (and past) providers to bring with you.



PETS

- **1.** Cats and dogs MUST be registered at the installation veterinary services office within 5 days of being assigned to a Fort Cavazos Family Housing residence.
- 2. All animals must:
 - a. Be microchipped
 - **b.** Wear a current collar (which has a home address) at all times
- **3.** Owners must provide verification of immunization records and pet registration to the Fort Cavazos Family housing at the community office
- at the community office. **4.** Residents may have a TOTAL of 2 pets (any form of combination).

OBTAINING A POWER OF ATTORNEY (POA)

- **1.** A power of attorney is a written document that authorizes an individual to act upon a spouse's behalf when he or she is unavailable.
- **2.** A general power of attorney could be used to sign documentation, set up utilities, etc.

SETTING UP A P.O. BOX

1. Gather all medical and dental records from current (and past) providers to bring with you.

RESERVING A HOTEL

- 1. Book a reservation ahead of time to ensure you have a place to stay ahead of your arrival. *Be sure to ask for extended stay rates for stays of 30+ days!*

PREPARE FINANCIALLY

- **1.** There can be upfront costs associated with your move (that later on, potentially be reimbursed).
- **2.** The service member will attend a Levy Brief prior to obtaining PCS order where they will go over:
 - a. Booking travel
 - b. Pay \$ allowances for travel
 - c. Shipping households goods (HHG)
 - d. Schedule the HHG date
 - e. Information regarding moving with pets and children
 - f. Filling out required paperwork
- **3.** If an additional credit card is needed, getting preapproved in a timely manner is suggested.



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

TERMINOLOGY

- **1.** PTDY (Permissive Temporary Duty) your soldier gets to help you move
- **2.** TLE (Temporary Lodging Expense) money allocated for lodging expenses during the move
- 3. PCS (Permanent Change of Station) where you will be moving to
- **4.** HHG (Household Goods) the household belongings being moved to new station

CAN MY SOLDIER HELP ME MOVE?

1. In most cases, soldiers are given permission to help their family move. In some instances, there may be a requirement that does not allow the soldier to provide assistance to the family.

HOW MANY DAYS DO WE GET TO MOVE?

- 1. PTDY CONUS = 10 days
- 2. PTDY OCONUS = 15 days
- **2.** *This is always at the discretion of approving supervisors, and soldiers are not always guaranteed a set number of approved days. TDY days do include weekends and holidays.

DOES PTDY COUNT AS LEAVE DAYS?

1. No

DO I NEED TO WAIT FOR THE MOVERS TO ARRIVE?

1. No. A Soldier can designate an assigned individual to sign the paperwork for movers. If you have a trusted family member or friend who is willing to be there the day to sign paperwork, they are allowed as long as the soldier assigns them ahead of time.

PRE-MOVE

WHEN CAN I GO WITH MY SOLDIER?

1. Once you are on the orders, and everything is set up, you and your soldier can travel together. If you move on post or participate in the Spouse PPP, you must arrive within 30 days of the spouse's orders.

CAN MY HHG BE PICKED UP FROM A STORAGE UNIT?

1. Yes, if you have items in a living space and/or storage, the movers can pick them up. Be sure to provide the movers details on all locations for goods.

CAN MY HHG BE PICKED UP FROM A STORAGE UNIT?

1. Your items will be stored up to 90 days at no cost.

HOW DO I SET UP THE MOVERS?

- **1.** You will first need your PCS orders, and a POA (if you are the spouse and attend the levy brief).
- **2.** Organize with the JPPSO (Joint Personal Property Shipping Office) at the post closest to your location.
- **3.** The army will go over the paperwork and assign the moving company for the soldier.
- **4.** Always call and confirm with the moving company the correct paperwork, addresses and approval ahead of time.



UNDERSTANDING THE TYPES OF MOVES



GOVERNMENT MOVE

The army will pack and move ALL belongings and you do not need to prep anything. Everything will be delivered and unpacked as well.

PARTIAL DITY

You will pack items in boxes, movers will come pick up items needed, and it will be shipped/delivered. You are eligible for partial reimbursement depending on how heavy your personal shipment is.

PPM (PERSONALLY PROCURED MOVE)

You pack and move everything yourself. You are eligible for reimbursement up to 100% of the GCC (Government Constructive Cost); an advance allowance can be authorized to assist with out-of-pocket moving expenses

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED

Movers will NOT move aerosols, flammable products, living animals, privately owned live ammunition, etc.



WHAT WAS IT CREATED FOR

The VA Loan was created in 1944 to assist returning soldiers from WWII as they purchased residential properties.

REQUIREMENTS OF LOAN

- -Be active duty for 90+ days continuous service
- -honorable/general discharge
- -For guard/reserve, 6 creditable years of service

GUARANTEED LOAN

- -The loan is guaranteed to be paid by the US Government in the event of a default.
- -It will alleviate the requirement for mortgage insurance.
- -It can be used for 1-4 unit properties intended to live in.

PROS

- -No down payment
- -No mortgage insurance
- -Lower interest rates
- -Can be used more than once up to

current loan limit

- -Potential for house hacking
- -No minimum credit score

CONS

- -Funding Fee (2.3%) first time, (3.6% for subsequent)
- -Lack of full knowledge/education from agents to advise clients with loan types

FIND THE BEST AGENT

Find a real estate agent to guide you and who can work with a good lender. Real estate agents who have built strong relationship and network can connect you to the best.

SAVE MONEY

Depending on the market, you could have to pay for your own closing costs. Different markets have different commands.

LENDERS

- -The VA does not have preferred lenders or affiliated lenders with the VA
- -You are not required to use a lender preferred by agents
- -Choose a lender that you can easily connect with, is accessible, and works in a timely manner

WHAT TO DO NEXT


- -Provide any necessary paperwork, signatures, information, etc. in a timely manner
- -Be patient
- -Ask questions

WHAT NOT TO DO

Do not open new lines of credit (including other loans, credit cards, or big purchases) -Do not move money around

LIVING - ON POST

"YOU WILL NOT BE ACTIVE ON THE HOUSING WAITLIST UNTIL YOU SIGN OUT OF YOUR CURRENT DUTY STATION/AIT STATION/SCHOOL STATION"



HOW TO APPLY FOR ON-POST HOUSING

- 1. Apply online.
- **2.** Preview floor plans/housing areas to get a better understanding of what housing looks like.
- **3.**Inform housing of what floorplans/housing areas you would be interested in.
- **4.** Paperwork can be emailed, faxed, or you can hand it in to the office. (This includings: copy of driver's licenses, DD1172 form, and official orders).
- **5.** When officially signed out of your CURRENT duty station/AIT/school, provide the housing your DA31 form.

PRE-MOVE

THINGS TO KNOW

- **1.** ALL of your BAH will automatically go to post housing. You will NOT receive BAH to your bank account.
- 2. Utilities will be covered
- 3. You must have official orders to apply for the housing waitlist.
- **4.** You must sign out of your current duty stations to be made active on the waitlist.
- 5. All on-post housing neighborhoods have fences already installed.
- 6. Wait times are about 1-3 months.
- **7.***Be sure to gather all of pet information (including proof of rabies, vaccines, and microchip ID #). This will be handed in to the on post veterinarian within 10 days of moving on post.

YOU'VE FOUND A HOME HERE AT FORT CAVAZOS!

Below are a few suggestions of some things to consider before moving forward as the owner of a new home!

UTILITIES

Make sure you get your utilities set up and check to make sure everything is working. If you need help with that I have provided a list of providers to help you.

CHANGE LOCKS

It's a good idea to change all the locks, garage codes, and security codes before moving into your new home.

KNOW YOUR HOME

Become familiar with your home. In case of emergency, you will need to know where everything is! The water shut-off valve, circuit box, etc.

NEW ADDRESS

Set up your new address. Inform your family, friends, HR department at work, creditors, and post office about your new address.







NOW WHAT?

KEEP IN MIND, YOUR SOLDIER MAY HAVE TO IN-PROCESS WITH THEIR UNIT AND MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST WITH A MOVE IN PROCESS.*

REQUIREMENTS

- **1.** Newcomers can find all information relivant to the move directly from depaartment of difense:
- a. Newcomer Resource at Ft. Cavazos
- **2.** Soldiers arriving for in-processing must report to: Copeland Soldiers Services Center (BLDG 18010), (254) 287-3832.
 - a. 24/7 availability right off TJ Mills
 - **b.** Must wear:
 - i. During business hours: Army Combat Uniform (ACU), Class A or B
 - **ii.** After duty hours: Civilian clothing
 - **c.** Bring: 5 copies of orders, leave form, military personnel file, all medical/dental records, financial paperwork

WHAT IF I CANNOT AFFORD THE MOVE?

1. Members can submit requests for advances (Advance Pay, Advance, Travel, PM to the Finance Office during the 30 day briefing). Service Members E-4 and below must have Commanders signature to request an advance pay. The request will be reviewed through finance for any authorization. Payments can be made approximately 10 days prior to the Service Members departure date from the installation or the soldier will be given a government credit card.

REIMBURSEMENT

- 1. Provide proof of receipts if you are claiming more than \$75 in tolls
- 2. Provide hotel receipts
- 3. Per diem categories: meals, lodging, incidental expense
 - a. Reimburse up to: \$200/day up to 10 days for hotel stay
 - b. Reimburse: \$0.22/mile when driving
 - c. Reimburse: \$140/day of travel (when driving by vehicle)
- **4.** *The Army will not pay to ship a vehicle on a CONUS move only OCONUS.

COMMON MISTAKES

AVOID THESE MISTAKES WITH YOUR NEW HOME

I IGNORING HOME MAINTENANCE

When you move into your new home is it usually in pretty good shape. However, there may be some ongoing maintenance tasks throughout the year to keep your home in good condition. 2 MAKING MAJOR RENOVATIONS

A few of the fees to keep in mind are homeowner's insurance, property taxes, utilities, HOA fees, as well as the cost of buying the tools and equipment to care for the landscaping and handle DIY repairs.

YEARLY CHECKLIST

Following a home maintenance checklist is a great way to ensure your property stays in tip-top shape, and dividing your maintenance tasks by season can help spread out costs and keep things more manageable so you don't get overwhelmed.

SPRING MAINTENANCE TIPS

Check for damage to your roof from winter storms. Get your roof inspected after major storms or hail to check for damage
Examine and replace extension cords that have become worn or damaged to avoid electrical fires
Make sure your fire extinguisher is accessible and operable
Repair cracked, broken or uneven driveways and walkways to prevent trips and falls
Uncover and check all exterior faucets for leaks or damage
Blow out your sprinkler systems and restart outdoor water sources

Inspect your wood deck or concrete patio for deterioration
Reseal your wood deck to extend its life and prevent water
damage

- Check your home for water leaks and/or damage
- Hire an arborist or tree trimmer to remove damaged or dead trees that might fall on or near your home

Clean refrigerator and freezer drip pans, and vacuum the coils
Clean the kitchen exhaust hood and air filter of buildup. You'll be using your stove and oven a lot more during the holidays

MORTGÅGE INTEREST

For most people, the biggest tax break from owning a home comes from deducting mortgage interest. For the tax year prior to 2018, you can deduct interest on up to \$1 million of debt used to acquire or improve your home.

REAL ESTATE TAXES


You can deduct the local property taxes you pay each year, too. The amount may be shown on a form you receive from your lender if you pay your taxes through an escrow account. If you pay directly to the municipality, though, check your records or your checkbook registry.

HOME IMPROVEMENTS

Save receipts and records for all improvements you make to your home, such as landscaping, storm windows, fences, and any additions. YOu can't deduct these expenses now, but when you sell your home the cost of the improvements is added to the purchase price of your home to determine the cost basis in your home for tax purposes. Keeping track of your basis will help limit the potential tax bill.

ENERGY CREDITS

Some energy-saving home improvements to your principal residence can earn you an additional tax break in the form of an energy tax credit worth up to \$500. A tax credit is more valuable than a tax deduction because a credit reduces your tax bill dollar for dollar.
