Denver International Airport

The 3rd busiest airport in the United States and the 6th busiest in the world, this airport supports direct flights from nearly every US airport. Here are nonstop flight times from major cities:

- Oklahoma City 1 hour 50 mins
- Salt Lake City 1 hour 30 mins
- Dallas 2 hours

- Chicago 2 hour 35 mins
- New York 4 hours 20 mins

It can be hard to choose just one season to visit Denver, Colorado. Here are some facts to help you pick:

Rainfall:

February sees just 0.49 inches of precipitation at the driest and with 2.32 inches, May is the wettest.

Sunshine:

Over 300 days a year make Denver remarkably sunny.

Snowfall:

March is Denver's snowiest month, with an average of 11.4 inches. Second most is April.

Seasons:

Winter is popular for snow sports, with numerous resorts a short drive away. Summer is the second most popular time, with outdoor activities ranging from whitewater rafting to hiking. Fall brings the changing foliage and Spring fresh blooms.

Festivals:

Spring through Summer bring the most festivals for visitors, but other times of year offer their own fun.




Real Estate Report 2024 (Year over year)




Single-Family Homes Sold (5/2022 - 5/2024)
