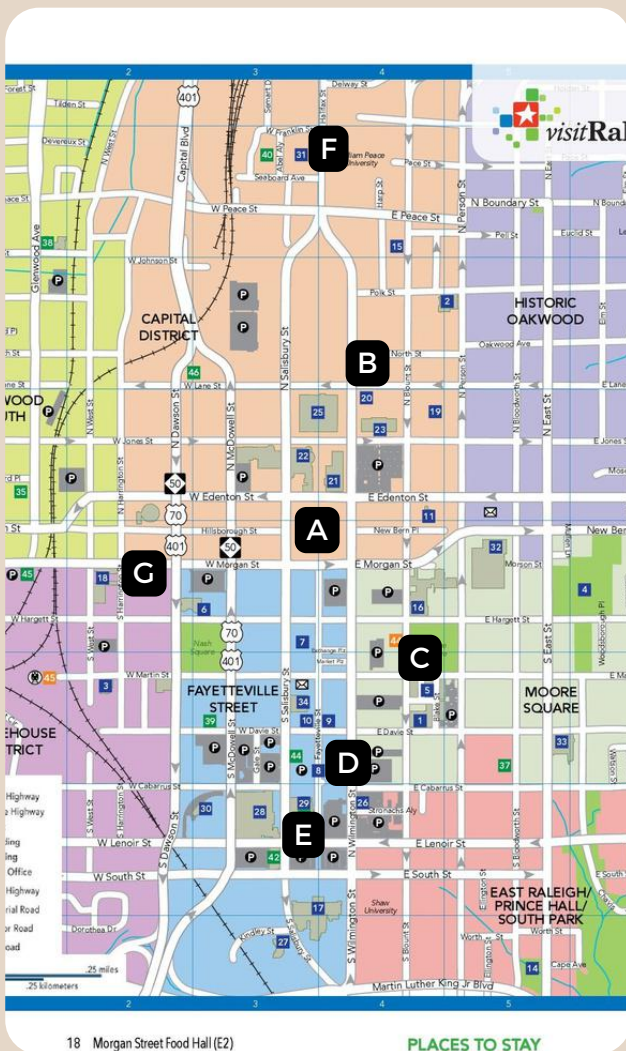
COMMUNITY RESOURCES

- G** Morgan St. Food Hall- Bustling marketplace showcasing local eateries with diverse, casual offerings, plus food retailers.



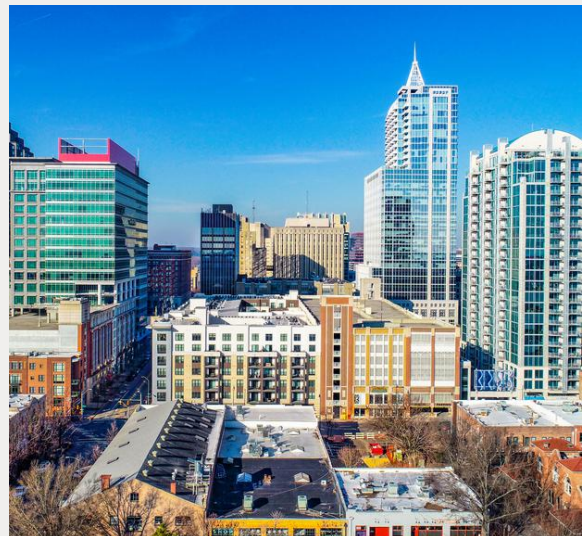
